Breakout two

How blockchain can transform our profession

Many say that blockchain might bring a digital revolution that would be comparable only to the internet. While the Internet has not eliminated lawyers, it has profoundly changed the way we do our work. The same may happen with blockchain. Due to its decentralised and automated nature, blockchain creates opportunities to establish new, alternative models for the economy, societies and governments. Lawyers will need new skills in order to provide their assistance in the context of blockchain.

The following issues will be addressed during the session:

- Smart contracts in the not so distant future, lawyers may find
 themselves drafting contracts and other documents in a way that
 resembles how developers code software. This will be possible thanks to
 smart contracts, one of the most interesting and promising applications
 of the blockchain technology.
- Blockchain as new jurisdiction blockchain has no jurisdiction, therefore lawyers who want to be active in this area should be ready to abandon traditional paradigms related to jurisdiction, international law etc.
- Blockchain as a threat to the legal profession blockchain applications remove the need to use trusted third parties. Some lawyers, such as notaries, may be eliminated from the market.
- Blockchain as an opportunity for the legal profession blockchain creates opportunities to establish new tools enhancing trust among lawyers (eg, trusted exchange of information and documents, trusted registers of professional qualifications etc.)




